

# First Birthday from ADAMedit

first birthday.xls

Using a text editor, edit the ADAMedit.ini file to allow first birthday. This is done by opening up the "ADAMedit.ini file and locating the statement "**AllowFirstBirthday = N**" and change the **N** to a **Y**. Save the change and exit the text editor.

Remove the standby controller card.

When on line with ADAMedit and from any screen, enter "**Shift-Control-Alt-1**" to bring up the first birthday dialog. Enter the floating password as explained below. **Password is case sensitive.**

(**note:** versions of ADAMedit prior to 1.06.03 will not require "Alt" in the command string to bring up the dialog)

Password format = **KVS911-xxx**

You will need the hyphen and the "xxx" represents the "(month-1)\*30 + the day of the month".

*(current cpu system date)*

Example 1 Jan 1 is  $1-1=0$  times 30 + 1 (for Jan 1) = 001

Example 2 Jan 31 is  $(1-1)*30 + 31 = 031$

Example 3 Feb 2 is  $(2-1)*30 + 2 = 032$

*Or, use the interactive file calculator by entering the month and day - then view the password as depicted below.*

Mo	Day	Yr	Password
3	23	99	<b>KVS911- 083</b>

This is identical in functionality to RESETCFG except it is built into ADAMedit and not a stand-alone program.

Recent systems should automatically first birthday when upgrading, but it is still a good utility to have.
