### **PROGRAM IMPROVEMENTS**

### **Problems Corrected**

- When pressing Proc Ctrl 2 with DME setup after choosing DME 1/2, the panel hung up.
- In KF, when Effect duration is set to "0," and Next KF/Prev KF was switched at a high speed, the switchers were all cleared.
- In a system with a redundant power supply, an abnormal power supply message was displayed. The algorithm to detect a momentary load change has been changed so that the message is displayed only when a continuous abnormality occurs.
- When issuing the duration attribute protocol from the axial editor to the DVS, the DVS processor was reset.
- When the Orthg button was selected in DME Ctrl, the Wipe Position Y parameter on the EL panel did not work in the downward direction.
- After copying between DME register channels from the switcher panel, the status display of No. 99 was the same as that of No. 98.

- When the DME was controlled from a switcher panel, powerup caused DME delegation in systems consisting of several DMEs.
- In the Disk menu, when the Effect register of the DME was called with the Shot Box function and the Run button was pressed, Effect was not executed.
